

## Conference Resolution...

In the business session of the 2006 Wisconsin District Conference, the following resolution was passed to help bring more churches into fellowship with the UPCI.

Resolution to Extend Temporary Fellowship to Non-UPCI Apostolic Pastors and Churches.

WHEREAS, The Wisconsin District desires to reach as many lost souls of Wisconsin as possible, and

WHEREAS, there are Apostolic churches in Wisconsin that are not a part of the UPCI, but have shown an interest in joining our Organization but have had little exposure to our fellowship and to the benefits that form a part of our fellowship in our District, such as camps, mens, and ladies retreats, seminars meetings, etc., and

WHEREAS, the Michigan District has approved a successful plan to invite other Apostolic churches to "taste and see" if they would like to belong to the UPCI by attending functions that take place in Michigan, and

WHEREAS, such a policy will offer a bridge of fellowship and possible inclusion of brethren of like faith into our fellowship,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

Apostolic pastors and churches that are not in the UPCI, but wish to have some exposure to our fellowship for the purpose of determining if it would be beneficial to them to join the UPCI, and be offered a UPCI pastor to serve as their sponsor. The UPCI pastor shall serve in a leadership/mentoring capacity to

the Applicant. If the application is approved, the pastor and the church may attend any camps, men's or ladies' retreats, seminars or other appropriate functions put on by the Wisconsin District. The approval shall be for only one (1) year and is not renewable.

The application will require the applicant to observe and be in agreement with all District Board requirements and policies regarding conduct, dress codes, and any other guidelines required by the District Board, while attending any UPCI functions. The approval will be for fellowship purposes only and shall apply to the Wisconsin District only. The Temporary Fellowship agreement with the Applicant will grant no rights or privileges to the Applicant, except for the freedom of attendance at the UPCI functions. The agreement with the Applicant will indicate that the Wisconsin District assumes no obligations or responsibilities to the Applicant pastor or church members. Further, the Temporary Fellowship may be terminated at any time by the District Board, without cause, by written notice to the Applicant. Prior to approval, the Applicant pastor shall meet with and be interviewed by the Presbyter of the section in which the Applicant church is located and all the requirements, guidelines and policies will be given to and accepted by the Applicant. The Application for Temporary Fellowship will receive final approval by the District Board.

The length of time this policy shall be in force will be at the discretion of the district board.

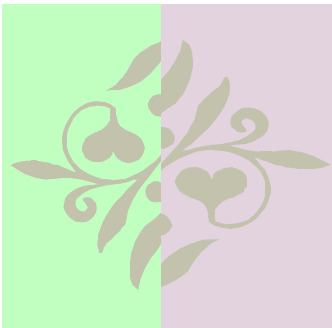
